

Peg Maguire Rolls 654 Set In SIWBA

The Staten Island Women's Bowling Association Tournament finished yesterday at Colonial Lanes with a blaze of high scoring in the doubles and singles events and new leaders in all three divisions.

The performance of the weekend, and of the tournament, was turned in by Peggy Maguire.

Mrs. Maguire, who had only a 42 handicap and had to beat Helen Marzocco's 472 in singles, blasted the highest women's series hit this season in Staten Island in league or tournament competition.

Peggy threw games of 209, 222 and 233 for a 654 set series, added 42 and took the lead and the singles championship with a 654 gross.

Then, in doubles rolling with partner Terry Ward, Mrs. Maguire rolled 603 on games of 298, 199 and 196. Teammate Terry had a 522 net series on games of 179, 161 and 182.

The Colonians, who were knocked into third place with their total of 2,908.

Mrs. Tamm, in the course of her 556, rolled a 235 that was the top net game hit in the course of the tournament.

Defending all-events championship Grace Vigliotti took a drubbing in her effort to retain the crown. Miss Vigliotti rolled only 516 in singles and added 73 for 591 and 27th place for the weekend.

She and Molly Bueco did better in doubles with a 14th place weekend finish but couldn't place among the tournament's best 25.

Though the scores from this past weekend are not official and may be changed, it seems safe to say that Peggy Maguire is the all-events champ for 1964.

On the 4-7 leave, I can constantly chip and leave the 2; what do you recommend?

If you're chipping the 4 from the 7, the chances are you're not coming into the hole at the proper angle. Be certain that you are standing on the approach in a position that is diametrically opposite the pin set up. In this way, you'll give yourself the widest possible angle as a target. Setting your stance in this position, "angle" the ball presently between the 1 and 2 pins. If your angle is accurate, you won't be able to chip.
