

Peg Maguire Met Woman Bowler of Year

Starting from the relative obscurity of a substitute in a local league at Bowling on the Green, Peggy Maguire culminated a rapid ascent to bowling prominence yesterday when she was officially named "The Metropolitan Woman Bowler of the Year" by a panel of sports writers.

It marked the first time that a bowler was the recipient of the highly coveted award. "I was shocked but extremely happy," related Peggy. "You hope for something like this, but when it happens, you still can't believe it."

The award, which is based on the bowler's performance during the 1965-66 season, is a fitting climax to Peggy's first year as a professional bowler.

And it was on the pro circuit where she demonstrated the ability which helped her win the award. She won five tournaments, was runner-up in another, and finished in the top five in several other pro events.

Peggy won both All-Ireland tournaments she entered, the State Open Match Game and the All-Ireland Open, and she did so convincingly. She finished as the second in the state finals while she came in as the runner-up in the All-Ireland event.

She ranked in 4800 on two Professional Mid-Atlantic tournaments. Her first victory, in late May of last year, was the determining factor in her turning professional. She took a strong field and beat them with a 191 average.

"I first I was a little apprehensive about bowling professionals but after my showing in this tournament, I feel more confident," she remarked at the time.

Her second MAWBA win was a little more spectacular. Despite some tough bowling, she was no better than third going into the final position match. She surprised the field, however, by shooting a sparkling 277 and vaulting into first place.

She averaged an amazing 210 per game for 30 games in that series, the highest series ever bowled in a MAWBA event. Her other win was a doubles victory in the Journal American tournament. She teamed with Jean Karamane (last year's Met Bowler of the Year) to grab high net hours in the doubles event.

She was a recent runner-up in the Bergen County Golden Pins Classic in which she took over 200 competitors. She got off to a slightly stalling start in this event, shooting a 600 series which included a 352 game.

In nationwide Professional Woman's Bowling Association events, Peggy never averaged less than 185, yet finished 12th twice and 14th another time. Her outstanding bowling in

met leagues sailed down the bowler's lane. She held a 100-200 average in the New Jersey Mixed Major League. She bowled a 210 series in the fifth inning, then powered a four-run sixth with a two-run double as Atlanta overcame a 1-0 deficit.
