ABC's dues increase draws mixed reaction

Inflation. Ah, yes. There is that word again which businesses and organizations use for an excuse to raise prices, fees, etc. Such is the reason why the American Bowling Congress, the men's governing body, raised its annual dues \$3 — from \$7 to \$10 — last March with \$5 now going to the local association (the New York Bowling Association in this case) and another \$5 to the ABC.

The increase, the second in the past three years, hasn't gone over very well with some local legions.

"It's a darn shame," said New Dorp resident Joe Palatore, who bowls in two ABC sanctioned leagues on the Island. "The average bowler, like myself, gets nothing out of it. I'm never going to get an award or anything like that."

The ABC wants their sanction money the first week of the season, "added another local legler. After that they could care less."

On the other hand, the increase wasn't such a major issue to others we interviewed.

"It doesn't bother me," said John Eadicicco. "Everything else you're involved in goes up, so why not this?"

"In order to do the job correctly, you have to charge more," said Sam Laursen, the manager at Country Lanes.

Despite the increase, Island proprietors contacted by the Advance said their legions have not dropped sanctioning as anticipated.

"The people are just annoyed they're charging \$10 now," said Wilkinson. "No one is pulling their sanctions. There's just a lot of static over it."

"People are a little worried about it, but they are putting up with it because they know to go with the ABC is the right thing to do," said Mike Pellegrino, part owner and manager at Colonial Lanes.

Considering all the ABC has to offer, perhaps, the \$10 fee isn't so steep.

ABC covers every facet of bowling — from awards to bidding to certification to equipment specifications to rules and much more.

"The (Women's International Bowling Congress) doesn't offer nearly as much as the ABC," added Laursen, who pays a \$5 annual fee for WIBC membership. "Sanctioning by the ABC is definitely worth it for the bowler. I think what the ABC is doing is great. I just think they should have started some of the things years ago."

As for future increases, Ted Guy, secretary treasurer of the New York Bowling Association, says "dues will not be increased for the next five to six years."

"The reason the increase was \$3 this time around is so we won't have to ask the bowlers for more money in two or three years," explained Guy.

And, the money, Guy assured, is being well spent.

"Some awards have already been upgraded and the ABC is planning on upgrading more awards further on down the line," explained Guy. "A lot of changes will be made. The bowlers are going to start to see where their money is going."

Fran Goldstein, the long-time junior coordinator at Columbian Lanes, has taken over as the junior bowlers program director at Colonial Lanes, according to ABC manager Mike Pellegrino.

"She's a welcome addition," said Pellegrino. "Her experience teaching the youngsters is tremendous. She'll be a very big help."

Goldstein is also the first vice president of the Staten Island Young American Bowling Alliance and the tournament director of the S.I. Touring Junior Bowlers Club.

"I'm very happy about it (the switch to Colonial)," said Goldstein, a Willowbrook resident, who spent 18 years at Colum-

bian Lanes. "It was time to move on to bigger and better opportunities."

Tots 2nd in Suffolk Coaches Invitational

KINGS PARK, L.I. — Totenville HS put together a solid team effort and placed second yesterday at the 23rd annual Suffolk Coaches Invitational at Sunken Meadow State Park.

Captain Peter Whitehouse's girls ranked fifth in the state, placed fourth in the top 10 and scored 65 points. Longwood, the state's fourth-ranked team, placed three in the top 10 and won with 34 points. Valley Stream Central was third with 80 points.

Tracy Capper ran her usual strong race, placing fourth in 20 minutes, 30 seconds for the 5,000-meter course, well behind the winner, Erin Dolan of Longwood, who won in 20:05.

Tone Bratteng (8th, 20:54.4), Jessica Lucas (12th, 21:42), Marcia Francis (13th, 21:50) and Christine Hillock (23th, 22:46), completed the Totenville team scoring.

Totenville also placed second in the junior-varsity race, scoring 41 points. St. Anthony's HS was the team winner, scoring 39.

Totenville's "B" team won fourth in the team scoring with 141 points.

Doreen Banks was the individual winner in 23:36.6. Kerri Olive led for most of the race but took a wrong turn, and eventually placed third in 24:14.2.

Totenville was again second in the sophomore race, scoring 80 points. Nemesis St. Anthony's won again, scoring just 47 points.

Suzanne Lee was the leading Totenville finisher, placing eighth in 23:05.8.
