Davis is alone at top in T-M East American

Defeats Pouch while Brothers hands

Richmond County Savings first loss

Defending champion Davis excitedly gained sole possession of first place in the Tyford-Muche Major League's premier East American division with a 7-4 win over Pouch Terminal yesterday at the Berry Houses field, Dongan Hills.

Davis (5-0) is the lone unbeaten team after Brothers Pastry handed Richmond County Savings Bank its first loss by coming from behind to win 6-4 at Berry.

Davis took a 3-0 lead in the first on a walk to Jimmy Ryan, a single by Roy Smith, a sacrifice fly by Jon Manellan, an RBI double by Joe Duroso and a sacrifice fly by Rich Collier.

Pouch cut the margin to 3-2 in the third on hits by Jon LaMattina and Mark Levine, a sac fly by Dave Levine and an RBI single by Joe McKeon, but Davis answered with four more runs in the bottom of the inning to take a 7-2 lead on two-run singles by Duroso and Steve Kuhn.

Dave Levine belted a two-run homer for Pouch in the top of the seventh to make it a three-run game, but winning pitcher Brad Keely got the final out on a pop to first. While Keely scattered 10 hits, he struck out four and didn't walk a batter.
